Interactive NAPLEX® Review

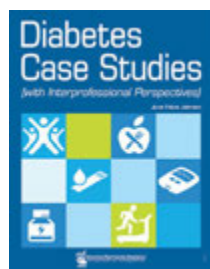

Active Learning Exercises to Enhance Studies

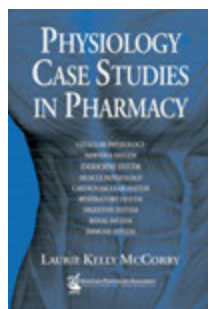

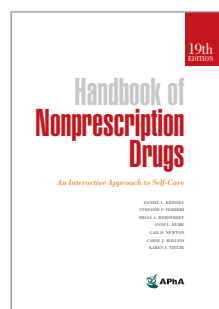
