Helping patients in need get access to Pfizer medicines

Pfizer invests heavily in the discovery and development of new treatments that give hope to patients around the world. But inventing medicines isn't enough. Pfizer understands that some people may have difficulty getting access to their medicines, either because they don't have insurance or because they are faced with high co-pay or co-insurance requirements.

The Pfizer Patient Assistance Program provides more than 60 Pfizer medicines for free to eligible patients through their doctor's office, at home, or – in some cases – via a co-pay card that will cover the entire cost of their co-pay at the pharmacy.*

What is the Pfizer Patient Assistance Program?

The Pfizer Patient Assistance Program provides Pfizer medicines for free to eligible patients who meet the income eligibility criteria and are having difficulty affording their medicines. The income eligibility for this program starts at 400 % of the Federal Poverty Limit, adjusted for family size. Income limits are subject to change on an annual basis.

Who is Eligible?

Both uninsured and insured patients may be eligible for help through the Patient Assistance Program.¹ To qualify for free medicine through the program, patients must:

- ✓ Meet income guidelines, which vary by product and household size
- ✓ Have no prescription coverage, or not enough coverage, to pay for their medicine
- ✓ Be treated by a healthcare provider licensed in the United States, Puerto Rico, or US Virgin Islands.

What Other Options are Available?

Patients who don't meet the requirements for the Pfizer Patient Assistance Program may still qualify for the Pfizer Savings Program.² The Pfizer Savings Program helps patients without prescription coverage get savings on Pfizer medicines through participating pharmacies. Savings can vary from 36 % to 75 %, depending on the product and the patient's income level.

This Pfizer Savings Program is an option for patients who are uninsured and whose household income exceeds the eligibility requirements for receiving medicines through the Pfizer Patient Assistance Program or for patients who need assistance with Pfizer-branded medicines no longer offered through the Pfizer Patient Assistance Program.

How do I Enroll and Learn More?
