



SITC Cancer Immunotherapy **Clinical Practice Guidelines**



Following the publication of SITC's Cancer Immunotherapy Clinical Practice Guidelines, SITC will create educational webinars and a uniquely designed mobile application to house the information. These guidelines are a collection of consensus statements developed by experts, to help oncologists determine when and how to best use immunotherapy to treat their patients.

Webinars

In 2022, SITC is continuing the popular Cancer Immunotherapy Guideline webinar series. To complement the introductory "101" webinars, SITC added "201" Practical Management Pearls webinars to include more specific details for each guideline and a deeper dive on unusual situations, as well as "301" Case Study webinars to highlight challenging cases. All attendees will have the opportunity to interact with webinar faculty during dedicated question and answer sessions and become part of a community for future networking.

Mobile Application

SITC recently launched a new mobile app for Clinical Practice Guidelines. The CPG Mobile App is the first and only tool of its kind, offering direct, easy, portable access to SITC's CPGs via phone or tablet. Scientific Workshop







The Tumor Immune Microenvironment – A Holistic Approach

April 21-22, 2022 ~ San Diego, CA

There is increased recognition of the importance of the entire tumor microenvironment in cancer immunotherapy. Integration of basic and translational work on the TME would enable a better understanding of the interaction between tumor cells and their surrounding stroma and immune cells. These discussions may benefit the full range of cancer immunotherapies, from antibody-based treatments to cellular therapies. Additional tools for exploring the TME may also be discussed, including systems biology approaches and the integration of artificial intelligence.

SITC-NCI Computational Immuno-oncology Webinar Series

The 2022 SITC-NCI Computational Immuno-Oncology Webinar Series will aim to educate clinicians about current computational technologies and platforms and how best to incorporate these approaches into clinical trials. Supplementing each webinar, all invited webinar speakers will develop a concurrent "technology review" manuscript that will be published in the *Journal for ImmunoTherapy of Cancer*.

Targets for Cancer Immunotherapy: A Deep Dive Webinar Series

Important scientific questions will be explored in this monthly series. It will include an overview of current scientific knowledge about a chosen therapy, a detailed discussion of the biology underlying the therapeutic mechanism and a summary of current clinical efforts in the field. A highlight of the series will be dedicated time for an interactive Q&A with in-depth questions and collaborative discussions.

SITC-ACCC Workshop 🔞

Expanding Community Access to Cell Therapy

Jun 2, 2022 ~ Chicago, IL

SITC and the Association of Community Cancer Centers (ACCC) will collaborate to host an innovative, in-person workshop to discuss how to apply lessons learned from academic cancer centers to the community setting. As immunotherapies continue to show efficacy and safety for the treatment of various cancers, it is of crucial importance that access to these therapies continues to increase. While academic medical centers often have infrastructure in place to expand and adapt to the changing immunotherapeutic landscape, community centers that serve a significant portion of cancer patients across the US face unique challenges that limit accessibility. In particular, cellular therapies for the treatment of patients with both solid and liquid tumors require sufficient infrastructure, specialized monitoring, dedicated administration protocols, and individualized training to facilitate safe and effective administration. The ultimate goal of the workshop will be to address these challenges and provide guidance on how to promote rapid patient access to novel immunotherapeutics.

Cell Therapy Regulatory Summit





August 3, 2022 ~ Napa, CA

The current lack of interaction between regulators, cell therapy researchers, and industry partners has resulted in limited standardization within the US FDA potentially causing stalled clinical advancement in cell therapies for cancer treatment and confusion among researchers in navigating the regulatory framework. SITC's strength in consensus recommendations and consensus building is unique among the many professional associations in the this space, SITC is working to establish a series of consensus meetings on critical regulatory topics concerning cellular therapies, each of which would result in a published whitepaper in JITC on one or more issues.

Focus on Quality



In 2019, SITC identified the need to bring greater emphasis and visibility to the importance of quality metrics in immunotherapy. To that end, a 3-phase project was created to begin addressing the need for meaningful measurement concepts.

Quality Measurement Project - Phase Three

Summer 2022

SITC intends to identify new gaps in immunotherapy clinical care and develop novel quality measures for submission to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for inclusions into national registries. This initiative is a direct continuation of SITC's successful 2021 efforts where the society successfully developed quality measures pertaining to immune-related colitis and biomarker testing.

SITC Patient Engagement and Advocacy Panel



Fall 2022

The SITC Patient Education and Advocacy Panel is a new initiative that provides support to immunotherapy patients and integrates their perspective into SITC efforts. The panel is developing new educational and advocacy content, implementing novel communications and dissemination strategies, and facilitating patient integration into SITC efforts.



Global Efforts



Immunotherapy has gone global and SITC has extended its reach to improve therapies worldwide. As part of a three year strategic plan, SITC is bringing programs to the IO community to address the barriers to worldwide immunotherapy access and develop actions to overcome them.

Global Regulatory Summit

Fall 2022 ~ Location TBD

The SITC Global Regulatory Summit is being developed as a direct follow-up to the first SITC Global Access workshop, "Global Access to Cancer Immunotherapy: Closing the Gaps". This in-person summit will serve as a forum for global regulatory stakeholders to discuss gaps between the progress in biologic and regulatory sciences in immunotherapy, as well as differences and similarities in regulatory approaches in immunotherapy development in different parts of the world.



Early Career Scientist Opportunities



Cancer Immunotherapy Winter School

2023

The SITC Cancer Immunotherapy Winter School is a comprehensive educational program, providing early career participants with a deep understanding of the core principles of tumor immunology and cancer immunotherapy. Attendees will also explore developing areas of the field, including:

- Biomarker technology, validation and clinical integration
- Clinical trial design, data analysis and considerations for combination therapies
- Grant writing to obtain research funding

This five-day program will instruct scientists and clinicians to advance scientific discoveries and clinical applications of tumor immunology and cancer immunotherapy.

The program also fosters professional development by facilitating student interaction with faculty and thought leaders in an intimate setting.

Clinical Immuno-Oncology Network (SCION) Workshop

2023

This unique initiative was developed to complement SITC's Cancer Immunotherapy Winter School, and is designed to assist those in the field of cancer immunotherapy who are interested in designing their own clinical trial protocol.

Through hands-on breakout sessions, participants will work in intimate small groups, each consisting of four to five students paired with three dedicated faculty including two clinicians/scientists and a statistician. These expert faculty are equipped to help their assigned students navigate through the unique considerations that accompany immunotherapy treatments, which will enable them to develop well-designed clinical trials that can effectively move the field forward.

WIN Leadership Institute



Aug. 1-2, 2022 ~ Seattle, WA

The Women in Immunotherapy Network's Leadership Institute (WIN) is a 1.5 day program that explores topics that benefit female scientists as emerging leaders in the field of cancer immunotherapy. The program will develop and enhance leadership skills as well as address topics around diversity, inclusivity, conflict management and negotiation. Each participant will increase their understanding of their role as an emerging leader.

In addition, female participants from clinical settings, industry, government and academia will be given an opportunity to network with one another and share experiences unique to the female perspective in the field of cancer immunotherapy.

Sparkathon 2.0 Accelerator



June 13-15, 2022 ~ New York, NY



As part of a larger effort to develop the next generation of cancer immunotherapy leaders, address the challenges in the field, and speed the pace of discovery, SITC is continuing to make strategic investments in the future of the field with Sparkathon 2.0.

As a unique vehicle to foster leadership development and innovation, Sparkathon 2.0 will involve a cohort of emerging leaders in the field and related disciplines. These diverse emerging leaders will be hosted at a special two and one half-day retreat to address key issues of significance in the field. The group will benefit from the opportunity to make meaningful contributions to cancer immunotherapy while learning useful leadership and business skills in a safe environment amongst peers. In addition, they will form connections across disciplines that may serve them in future, cross institutional research endeavors.







Industry Program: Combinations Hybride

Nov. 8, 2022 ~ Boston, MA

A Pre-Conference Program of SITC's 37th Annual Meeting

As part of the SITC Annual Meeting & Pre-Conference Programs, the SITC Industry Program provides a forum for industry representatives to discuss ongoing research programs to advance the field of cancer immunotherapy. Design, topic selection and organization of each SITC Industry Program is led by members of the Industry Committee that represents over 30 companies from across the globe. The Industry Program will focus on combinations and using artificial intelligence, machine learning, and/or predictive models to identify patients who will most likely respond to early intervention. It will also explore novel statistical models to refine and optimize clinical trial design.

Workshop on Combination Approaches to Immunosuppression

Nov. 9, 2022 ~ Boston, MA A Pre-Conference Program of SITC's 37th Annual Meeting

The SITC Annual Meeting Workshop will focus on combination approaches to addressing immunosuppression. This Workshop will explore the underlying biology of combination therapies and how those combinations can overcome specific mechanisms of resistance. Armed with a deeper biological understanding of how rational combinations and sequences of therapies can overcome specific resistance mechanisms, attendees will be equipped to design effective clinical trials leading to better patient outcomes.

Policy on Satellite Programs



- 4. Exhibit staff is limited for each booth (see package options on previous page) and all staff are required to have badges. Exhibit booth staff badges allow entry to the exhibit hall only.
- The exhibit area will be open to delegates. As such, SITC, the exhibit service contractor and the meeting venue shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibitor property.
- 6. SITC must pre-approve all messaging to be sent to registered meeting delegates.
- 7. Attire of exhibit personnel should be consistent with the business casual atmosphere of the convention.
