WHAT ARE VARICOSE VEINS?

Your veins carry blood to your heart. Valves within your veins keep blood moving in the right direction. If vein valves become weak, blood can flow backward. This backward flow of blood is called vein reflux.



Vein reflux causes blood to pool inside the veins. When blood pools, your veins can become stretched, twisted, or enlarged. These are called varicose veins.

Varicose veins occur most often in your legs. That's because veins in the legs carry extra pressure from sitting or standing.

Varicose veins can become visible bulges on your legs. Varicose veins can also cause pain and discomfort.

If left untreated, varicose veins can lead to more serious problems. These include blood clots and skin problems.

Diagnosing varicose veins

To diagnose varicose veins, your doctor will conduct a physical exam. He or she will look at your legs and ask about pain or other symptoms. Your doctor may also order an ultrasound test. This test can show how blood is flowing inside your veins.

DO YOU HAVE VARICOSE VEINS?

Most people associate varicose veins with the bulges and discoloration they cause in the legs.

While their appearance alone can lead you to seek treatment, varicose veins often come with other painful or irritating symptoms.

AM I AT RISK FOR VARICOSE VEINS?



Varicose veins are common. Many things can increase your risk of developing this condition.

- **Age** is a risk factor for varicose veins. As you age, circulation changes can cause varicose veins.
- **Certain health conditions** increase your risk of varicose veins. These include diabetes, high cholesterol, and high blood pressure.
- **Family history** of varicose veins or deep vein thrombosis (DVT) puts you at higher risk for varicose veins.
- Lifestyle factors and job requirements can impact your risk for varicose veins. Sitting or standing for long periods can increase your risk for varicose veins. An inactive lifestyle also puts you at higher risk for varicose vein development.
- **Obesity or being overweight** puts pressure on your veins. This added pressure can lead to varicose vein development.
- **Pregnancy** can put pressure on the large vein that feeds your legs. This pressure can lead to varicose veins.

Talk with your doctor about your risk factors for varicose veins.
